



The Purdue Extension Floyd County and Sunnyside Master Gardeners will host Pollinator Day on Saturday, Apr. 27! This free, family-friendly event will be from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. on the lawn of the Purdue Research Park of Southeast Indiana (3000 Technology Ave., New Albany, IN 47150), weather permitting.

Activities include booths on Native Bees, Butterflies, Pollinators and Our Food Supply, Hummingbirds, Native Plants, Planting for Pollinators, Beeswax Lip Balm, a Pollinator Selfie Booth, Pollinator Putt Putt, and much more. 

Issue 3 Recipe

Kale and Mango Salad

Let Us Learn, Inc
A meal prep favorite!
Breaking Bread and Barriers Meal Prep

Ingredients:

1 bunch kale or large bag stalks removed and discarded, leaves thinly sliced

2 lemon, juiced

Shredded carrots

Finely chopped red onion

1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil

Kosher salt

4 teaspoons honey

Freshly ground black pepper

Cilantro

Cotija Cheese

2 mango, diced small (about 2 cups) or Frozen Mango, thawed (1/4 mashed)

Toasted pepitas (pumpkin seeds), about 1/3 cup

Crispy Chickpeas

Salt and pepper to taste



- 1. In a large serving bowl, add the kale, half of the lemon juice, a drizzle of oil, and a little kosher salt. Massage until the kale starts to soften and wilt, 2 to 3 minutes. Set aside while you make the dressing.
- 2. In a jar, add together the remaining lemon juice with the honey, 1/4 of the mango, finely chopped cilantro, and lots of freshly ground black pepper. Add the oil. Shake until well combined.
- 3. Taste. Pour the dressing over the kale, and add the remaining mango and pepitas. Toss and serve.
